Alf and Pauline Padgett have written this story on their prize holiday they won at Kingfisher Bay Resort, Fraser Island. Enjoy the read and be envious.....

To the Morris Register QLD what a surprise it was to be rung up and informed we had won a holiday to Fraser Island as part of the Morris Register of Qld National rally.

We had to book in and times were restricted to off peak times which did not worry us so times were set and away we went.

We stopped at Werris Creek then on to Toowoomba before stopping at Col & Glennis Hall's at Caboolture for 2 days then off to Tiaro calling in to Lance and Gwen Simmers. Lance & Gwen drove us to the barge landing at River Heads for the trip to the Island. It was very foggy but they assured us that the Island was out there somewhere, a 45 minute voyage and we saw some dolphins through the fog.

Upon landing we were bused to Kingfisher Bay Resort reception and on checking in we were told that our room would be ready by midday, so we walked around the resort to get our bearings. We arrived at our room to find our baggage had even been delivered. After lunch we walked along the beach taking in the different types of sands and at sunset we were on the beach in the deck chairs lazily watching the sun setting over Hervey Bay.

Next morning, 8.30, we boarded the 4WD bus to go to the eastern side of the Island taking in all the sights to be seen. At Eli Creek we boarded a light aircraft and saw whales breaching and quite a lot of lakes that can't be accessed by tracks. Back into the bus and took in the remnants of *The Maheno* washed up on the beach in 1934 then on to Eurong Beach Resort where lunch was supplied by the tour operators. Central Station is prime rain forest with pristine water and huge trees and lovely walks. On to Lake McKenzie where we had a swim albeit very cold then headed back to the resort at 4.45 pm. It was a very big day. Next day we relaxed and walked to the Kingfisher lookout and later to McKenzie's Wharf, on the eastern beach.

We caught the ferry home the next afternoon to be met at River Heads by Jill in her Morris Convertible and Lance and Gwen arrived to drive us back to Tiaro via Maryborough. Jill ferried us back to the mainland check in office reception in her Morris. What a fitting end to a wonderful holiday.

After reading Alf and Pauline's story you may think 'oh well another lucky couple'.....but my friends, all is not lost, you have another opportunity to win a 3 x night holiday at Kingfisher Bay Resort and more.....

You've got to be kiddin! THAT!....but he had his heart set on it.....so be it, it's only money after all. So home we go with crates of rusted bits and pieces with the assurance *'it's all there, just have to put it together'*. Oh, yeah, heard it all before and when is this rally coming up? Easter 2018, hmm we'll see. So begins the crate scrounge, *what's in here?, what's this bit?, where is it? I'm missing a box!! It's not all here!,...there must be another crate somewhere?. 'No, Jill didn't put it on EBay'.....*and so it continues! I couldn't get a story out of my dearest Keith so I decided to tell it from my point of view.

He acquired a 1929 Morris Minor on the way home from the 2016 Nationals in Warrnambool, in bits, and I really mean bits. At the same time there was another selling in Bundaberg. At least it looked like a vehicle and amazingly, it was even attached to four wheels! Well, Keith is a begger for punishment and decided *I'll give it a go!...Consequently*, over the past year he disappeared into the shed never to be seen again. Sometimes the shed was quiet and I'd think, *ok, I'll take him a cuppa.....*but on the shed pathway hearing a few bangs together with a repertoire of colourful words soon had me revising my decision!. From my point of view, I'll tell you what it takes to keep the man happy....when he places a couple of black painted polished mudguards on my lovely white quilted bedspread....an understanding wifey (calmly) thinks of the alternative, so, best keep it zipped. And where's my favourite old sharp knife? Don't forget the pricey irreplaceable chrome vehicle ornaments and headlights (with glass) locked away in the old wooden corner crockery cabinet, chrome bumper bars under the bed, and the windscreen - well I tell you the grandchildren just 'ain't comin' this Christmas till the car is built. With priceless parts wrapped and stashed away I think it's best we have Christmas with the grandkid's in Babinda, North Queensland, even I don't know what's wrapped up under there or behind the foldup bike in the spare room, or the camping solar panels in the cupboard.

Just when I think the problems are insurmountable he calmly says *'well, I'll just have to make it myself.....'* and he does and it works out fine but occasionally I'll find him wandering, muttering *'where did I put that part.....only got it yesterday'*.
